- A federal class action lawsuit was filed in 2021
 - The complaint alleged a number of systemic deficiencies
 - A settlement agreement was signed into order on 9/21/2022

DS Identified Goals

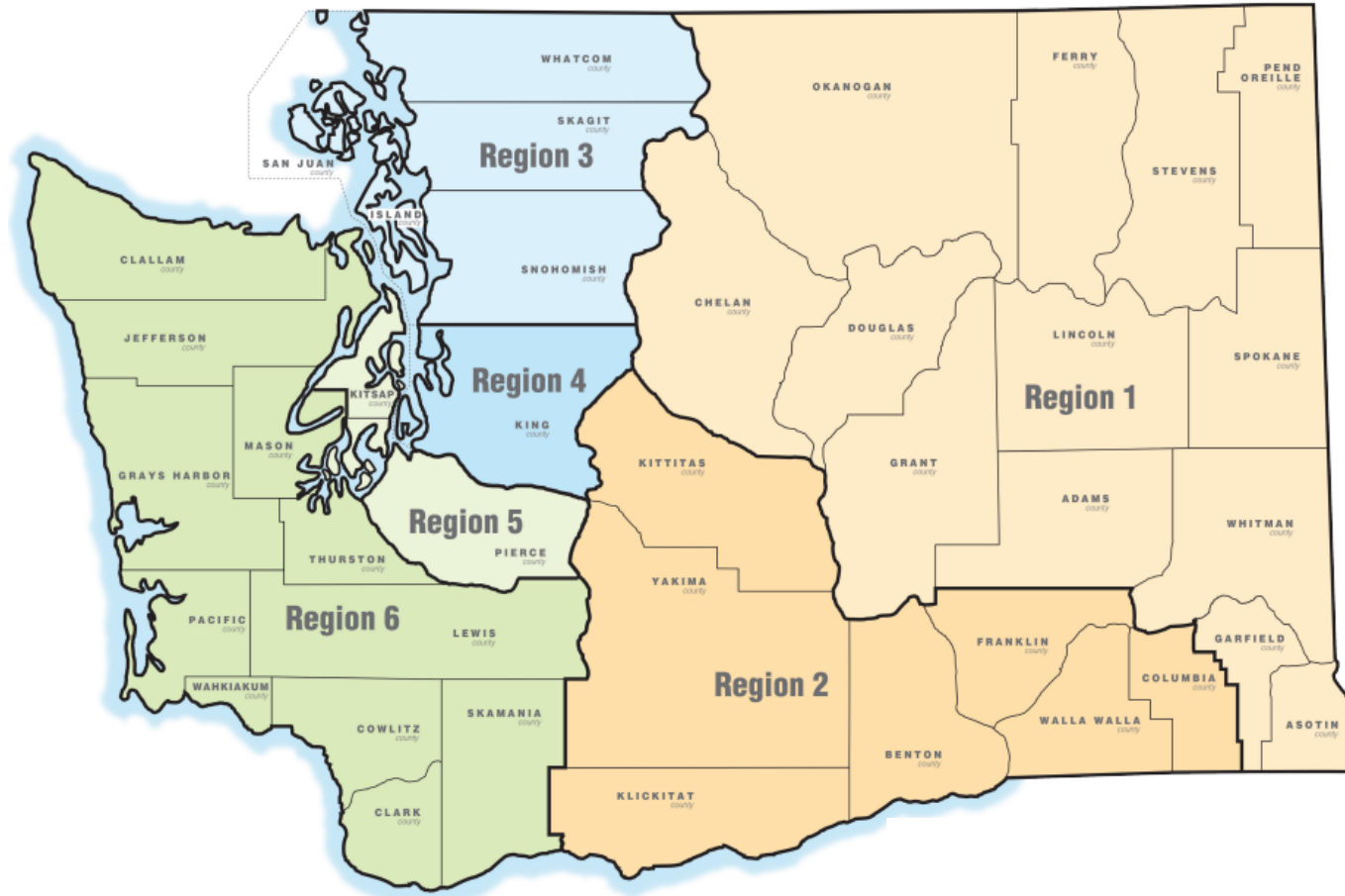

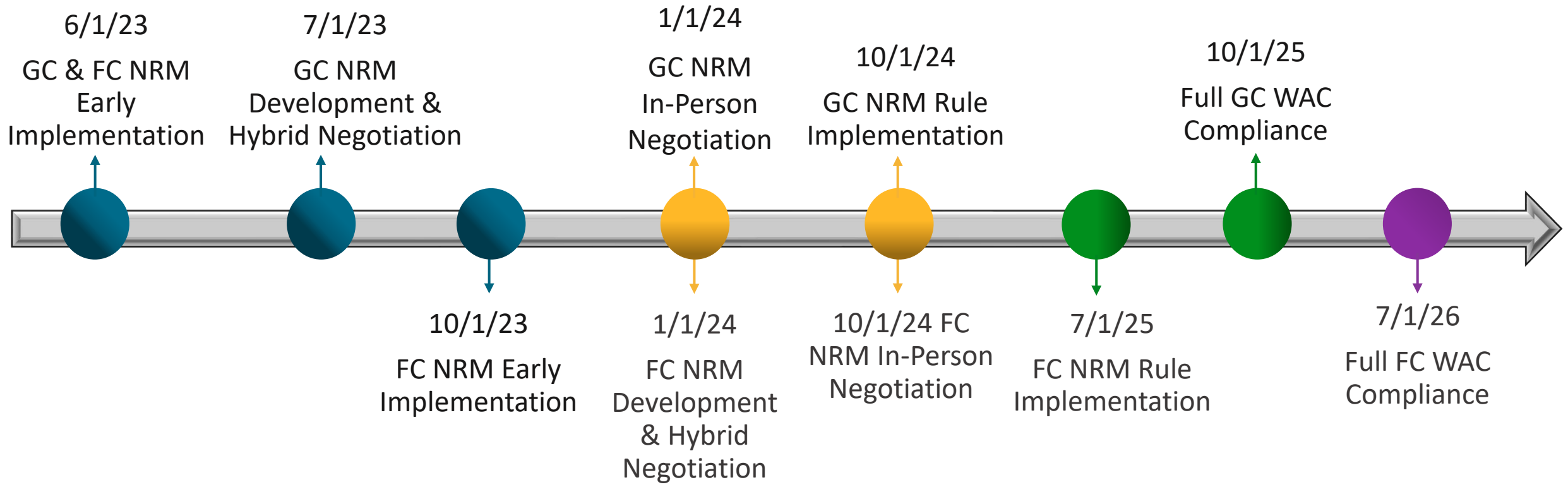
DCYF Regional Map
