PAG Recruitment and In-Person Meeting

DCYF Community Engagement Manager, Emily Morgan led the group in a discussion regarding PAG recruitment and the plan for an in-person meeting.

| Discussion | Our original plan was to have an all-day in-person meeting on July 12th. However, our outreach and recruitment for PAG members has been delayed. Recruitment should be going out in the next couple of weeks, but this has pushed back our timeline. A concern is that any new parents coming onto PAG might not be able to arrange things in time to join the in-person meeting. Does this group have thoughts on making the July 12th meeting virtual and moving the in-person meeting to September 20^{th?} I think that sounds like a good idea. Where would the meeting be? Currently, the plan is to hold the meeting at the Four Points by Sheraton in Sea-Tac. My concern with holding an in-person in September is that kids are back in school. Parents might have more freedom in the summer. I agree. I want parents be able to have the time to put things together but summer is easier. How long is an all-day meeting? Can you explain logistics? The meeting would likely be 9am-4:30pm. We provide refreshments and lunch. If you live more than 50 miles away we would arrange travel for members including a hotel room, airfare/rental car/gas stipend. Would family be welcome? Yes, they are welcome to travel with you. In the past, partners and kids did not participate in the meeting. If summer is a better option, would could push the July in-person meeting to August. Please note, for any in-person meeting we will always have a virtual option for those who cannot attend. August is great. We could still meet virtually in July to touch base about the in-person meeting. |

| Discussion | I think excluding child support when it comes to assessing eligibility is really important. My child's father was ordered to pay child support, but I rarely received the payments. The seamless referral or plan of care has really changed lives. Is extending eligibility for Early Childhood Education and Assistance Program (ECEAP) and Head Start about income? Yes, some of that is about income: How do we make more families eligible for those pieces and increasing eligibility but also continuing to remove barriers. The other piece related to that is around supporting permanency through guardianships. Adoption requires termination of parental rights which is traumatic for everyone involved and can be really complicated. We're looking at how do we support families post adoption and post guardianship so that the family is stable. There are lots of supports for adoptive mothers, but I would like to see more resources and supports dedicated to adoptive fathers. |
