- I would agree with extending the time of hybrid meetings to build community and have more time together.
 - I agree, it feels like we're rushed for decision making. If the meetings are longer, I'm hoping we don't pack more items and not leave time for decisions and critical conversations.
- I think Rate Setting will continue to be a topic, correct?
 - Yes. Evaluation updates:
 - o I would suggest fiscal budget updates.
- Discussion on core competencies.
 - Start Early would be happy to continue to talk through the core competencies and share progress.
- Will the workforce committee step back a bit?
 - No, subcommittee meetings are active and moving with HVAC recommendations. The subcommittee meetings will take place during the off months of HVAC.
- Given budget uncertainties we should build out time for that as well.

- Could there be an opportunity to discuss training (not required) that we are wanting to help support home visiting.
- Assessing progress on HVAC recommendations and priorities for the year could be good to talk through at some point.



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System updates and questions

Members provided system updates and had an opportunity to ask any questions.

	Are we targeting mid-October for finalizing rates?	
Discussion	 Yes, we're aiming for that date. 	
	 Concern that the Request for Proposals (RFP) will not generate a response for SB 6109. It's missing why it's being done and other opportunities within the bill. Emphasizing the training could make it appealing and highlight other preventative services. Provision of contracted slots, paid to hold capacity, and referral path could be further discussed. Can you share your list of examples via email so we can ensure we add these in the correct places? We have a session coming up and can go through it more. Looking at the same communities with the 6109 slots, there's conversations/coordination happening and linking the referral process. How would holding slots work with rate setting? We're not paid to hold slots. I don't see a way with funds. We model the contracted slot off a program in child welfare. Providers are contracted to be available for the first 72 hours, so you're paying for the capacity. For Nurse Family Partnerships (NFP), it likely won't fit but interested in exploring other options.
