Rule Making Update

Proposed Rules

Licensing Division updates to training requirements, capacity waivers for family home child care programs, prohibiting behaviors, WACs

The DCYF Licensing Division filed <u>WSR 24-22-108</u> to open the public comment period on proposed revisions to rules on:

WACs 110-300-0106 and WAC 110-301-0106:

• The language is being amended to allow a three-month timeframe to obtain training requirements for child care and early learning programs, specifically including first-aid and CPR certification.

WAC 110-300-0358 will allow DCYF to:

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- Issue capacity waivers to allow no more than 16 children in a family home child care program, and only after meeting all requirements.
- Require better coordination between DCYF, child care providers, and local building authorities.
- Revise requirements for emergency preparedness with this waiver.

WAC 110-300-0331, WAC 110-301-0331, and WAC 110-302-0331:

• The language of the WAC does not clearly forbid child care providers from harming children. This rule change requires an immediate and permanent change to the WAC chapters to protect children from harm.

To participate in the permanent rulemaking process for these rules, the last day to submit feedback on the proposed rules is Tuesday, December 10, 2024. You can provide feedback using one of the following methods:

Water Testing for Lead and Copper Offered to Child Care Programs

Child care and early learning programs in Washington state are required to test their drinking water for lead and copper when seeking licensure and every six years after. The Washington State Department of Health offers free lead and copper testing for drinking and cooking water, which fulfills <u>WAC requirement 110-300-0235</u>.
