## Why is Reliability Important for Evaluation

- Scoring is aligned across programs
- Scoring is aligned across home visitors
- Scoring accurately reflects parent-child interactions across all families measured.







## Methods to Assure Reliability - PICCOLO

- Video of measured interactions
- Comparing Scores
   *Model Developers score Programs Supervisors score HVSA/State score*







## Methods to Assure Reliability - HFPI

- Reliability of tool with parent scoring
- Use of the Tool as questionnaire or self-assessment e.g. how much is the parent educator involved in completion

### **Using Tool & Data Sharing**

- Each home visitor must use the tool with at least 5 parent-child dyads (different families) – more is acceptable!
- Program determines which families with following guidance
  - Use age recommendations of tool
  - Prefer younger child (to avoid aging out)
  - Prefer families who are more newly enrolled
- Enter scores into VisitTracker, noting which parent-child dyad was assessed to allow linkage of 2<sup>nd</sup> score
- Follow up with second measurement with same parent-child dyad at least 6 months later, entering scores in VisitTracker







## Home Visitor/Supervisor Feedback

- Spring 2022
   Method directed by this group (e.g. survey, focus group, both options?)
  - Home Visitors who have used the tool with at least 5 dyads
  - Supervisors give feedback on teams' experience during workgroup sessions

#### Piloting Steps – Current PICCOLO Users

#### **Program:**

Currently using PICCOLO



#### **Home Visitors:**

**Initial assessment** with
5+ families



#### **Home Visitors:**

**Second assessment** with linked families



#### Program:

Enter data into data systems and share with DOH (domain scores)



#### **Home Visitors:**

Participate in feedback with DCYF (survey or focus group) on use and utility of tools







#### Link to Performance Awards

- 1. Home Visitor completes training and is reliable in use of PICCOLO, HFPI or both (\$500)
- 2. Home Visitor uses the tool with **5** enrolled parent-child dyads and shares that data with DOH (via Visit Tracker) *\$150 per 5 dyads* 
  - For those currently using PICCOLO, Home Visitor follows-up 6
    months later using the tool with <u>same</u> 5 enrolled parent-child
    dyads and share data \$30 per dyad
- 3. Participate in feedback activity with DCYF on use and utility of tool \$100
