Prevention Decision Package	<ul> <li>Home Visiting Expansion and Improvement</li> <li>Continued expansion of slots, prioritization of locales with highest rates of maltreatment</li> <li>Support for Home Visiting Workforce</li> </ul>
	Substance Use Disorder Treatment  • Targeted support for families at risk of further child welfare involvement, particularly infants and young children.
	<ul> <li>Strengthening Families Locally Expansion</li> <li>Targeted selection of communities to expand the Strong Community Network Strategy into, particularly those experiencing high levels of racial disproportionality in intakes</li> </ul>

ECEAP Expansion to meet Entitlement - slots	<ul> <li>For the 2023-24 school year, ECEAP will begin to need 3,200 slots per year to meet entitlement</li> <li>For the 2023-24 school year, ECEAP will ask for conversion from Part Day to School Day or Working Day to better meet the needs of families and communities.</li> </ul>
Elimination of Background Check Fees Decision Package	Proposal to eliminate all background check fees paid by individuals who must pass a background check to provide services, work with, or have unsupervised access to children and youth.



	The Impact of Background Check Fees
	<ul> <li>For Child Care Providers, the payment process can take up to five (5) days, which delays the start of the background check process</li> </ul>
	<ul> <li>For Child Care Providers, delays caused by fee collection lead to loss of potential employees, and in some cases closed classrooms</li> </ul>
	<ul> <li>Fees have a disproportionate impact on those who cannot afford to pay, but are qualified to work, provide services or have unsupervised access to children and youth</li> </ul>
	Pilot included in 2021-23 proviso to determine feasibility of a license for multi-site owners
	<ul> <li>Proviso directed work to occur from July 1, 2021 – July 1, 2024; funding only provided through 2023</li> </ul>
	<ul> <li>Funding needed for pilot's third year, and for one year of implementation, including resources for training and marketing</li> </ul>
Organizational License Pilot	
Continuation Decision Package	Response to cumbersome and redundant licensing process
	<ul> <li>Pilot created requirements and regulatory changes to create a license category for an organizational license that streamlines meeting requirements</li> </ul>
	Pilot explores how organizations with multiple sites and other organizational programs serving children are able to expand community-based services to all Washington state children
