

JR Continuum Weekly Summary

9/14/2024– 9/20/2024

DCYF JR’s residential placement continuum includes two secure institutions: [Green Hill School](#) (GHS), and [Echo Glen Children’s Center](#) (EGCC); 8 [minimum security community Facilities](#) (CFs); and [Community Transition Services \(CTS\)](#). GHS and EGCC serve young people with minimum, medium, and maximum-Security Classifications; CFs serve qualifying individuals with minimum security classifications, and CTS serves qualifying individuals of all classification. Placement decisions in CFs and CTS are made through a [multi-display team review process](#).

Community Assisted Reentry (CAR)

[CAR](#) is a voluntary program for young people without an obligation to parole aftercare, county probation or DOC supervision to receive services. CAR is averaging 54 monthly participants

Parole Obligations

8 out of 18 young people released so far in September 2024 have been released to parole.
