JR Transition and Reentry

JR services are designed to increase the youth's prosocial behavior, to prepare them for a successful reentry back into their communities, and to link youth and families to effective services and community supports.

Functional Family Parole (FFP), JR's parole aftercare model, helps youth and families work more effectively together. They help youth and families increase hope and positive communication. Parole Counselors assist youth in generalizing key skills learned during their residential stay. They help youth improve the likelihood of achieving a successful reentry, accessing education, and finding and maintaining employment.

FFP Aftercare Services

Parole Counselors, together with Residential staff, start working with youth and families early on in the youth's stay. Youth and their families will participate in Reentry Team Meetings (RTMs) to learn about treatment and be part of the planning process for the youth's transition through JR and reentry to home and community. Some JR youth will be eligible for placement at a Community Facility (locations listed on back). JR staff will provide more information about this option to youth and families during the initial RTM.

Eligible youth receive parole aftercare for a period of time, ranging from four to 36 months. Youth and families will be notified of what type of parole the youth qualifies for early on in their residential stay. If a youth does not qualify for parole, JR staff will assist them with reentering back into their community.

Parole counselors help identify resources and services that match youth and family needs. Counselors listen and learn about what success means to each youth and family so they can effectively support their participation in community resources while supervising parole compliance.

FFP Aftercare Services

Additional services offered include:

- Functional Family Therapy (FFT)
- Family Integrated Transitions (FIT)
- Connections to community resources
- Graduated responses for parole compliance
- Interstate compact services for youth relocating out of state
- Educational programming
- Links to employment & training including vocational rehabilitation
- Treatment for mental health, substance abuse, and sexual offending behaviors
- Life Skills and Reentry Support
