## System Improvement 4.13 Qualified Residential Treatment Program – Training Plan

The DS Lawsuit Settlement requires that qualified individuals will be trained on interviewing children and youth, with a specific focus on capturing youth and family voice. The qualified individuals completing in-person QRTP assessments will have training that is culturally responsive, LGBTIA+ affirming, and trauma informed care.

All current and incoming Intensive Resources Program Consultants will be required to complete the training listed below, which is grouped by area of focus.
