**SUBJECT**: Changes to the <u>4308. Dependency Petition Process</u> policy

#### Purpose

The purpose of this policy memo is to provide guidance to child welfare employees regarding Senate Bill 6109 that now requires caseworkers to consider high potency synthetic opioids as a determining factor when filing a dependency petition and recommending out-of-home care.

This policy is currently being revised. This memo will be in effect from June 6-30, 2024.

#### Policy

Caseworkers filing dependency petitions must recommend an out-of-home placement when it has been determined necessary to prevent imminent physical harm due to CA/N, including that which results from sexual abuse, sexual exploitation, a pattern of severe neglect, or a high-potency synthetic opioid.
