

DCYF is Accepting Applications for the State Interagency Coordinating Council (SICC) Service Delivery Committee

The Department of Children, Youth, and Families (DCYF) is recruiting members for the State Interagency Coordinating Council (SICC) Service Delivery Committee and is accepting applications from qualified and interested individuals.

About the Service Delivery Committee

The purpose of this new committee is to engage experienced early intervention providers representing multiple disciplines to make recommendations regarding areas of service delivery that require statewide consistency. Members will be tasked with developing research-based recommendations to the SICC regarding practice guides, levels of service, caseloads, and best practice regarding service delivery models for ESIT.

Membership

Early Support for Infants and Toddlers (ESIT) is committed to ensuring diverse representation on its committees, including geographic diversity. This committee will be comprised of individuals with the following experience or role:

- Parents/caregivers
- Early intervention provider agency staff, including:
 - o Family Resource Coordinators
 - Special Educators
 - Occupational Therapists
 - Speech Language Pathologists
 - Physical Therapists, etc.

Members commit to 1.5 to 2 hour virtual meetings approximately every 4-6 weeks, with in-person meetings up to once a year. The length of term follows the term of the SICC member. Non-SICC members serve a one-year term with two-year terms thereafter. SICC members are expected to:

- Attend all meetings (or notify committee chair if unable to attend)
- Advise and assist the committee in meeting committee objectives
- Review materials and resources prior to meetings
- Share information and knowledge on committee topics
- Support the committee in reaching their goals (accessing and distributing resources)

Committee members are eligible for mileage reimbursements to help support participation. Mileage will be reimbursed at current state travel reimbursement rates and in accordance with the State of Washington Office of Financial Management Travel Regulations.
