Tribal IECMHC Funding Requests Due TODAY

- Requests may be up to \$30,000 per child care or early learning site
- Non-competitive funding opportunity.
- Approved funds must be spent by June 30, 2023
- DCYF will purchase or reimburse in the following categories:
 - Professional development or training
 - Hosting a community event
 - Purchase of materials, curriculum, or resources
 - IECMH consultant hours
 - Other culturally congruent mental health supports





Good news! Tribal IECMHC funding will be ongoing! If you are unable to request or allocate funds to use before the end of June, DCYF will open another round of funding this summer. The new round of funding may be used to support your programs between July 1, 2023 and June 30, 2024.
