Combined In-Home and Transition Services

2023-25 Decision Package

This Decision Package includes investments in combined in-home and transition services allowing for increased access to services for clients across divisions of the Department of Children, Youth, and Families (DCYF). Combined in-home services serve families involved in child welfare through prevention or reunification. Transition services are available to young people exiting the child welfare or juvenile rehabilitation systems.

OVERVIEW:

- DCYF is seeking to lay the foundation for a robust continuum of services that allow families to seamlessly access needed services.
- The existing service capacity is not meeting current demand and recent legislation and court cases are continuing to create additional demand for services provided to DCYF clients.
- Services must be culturally responsive and tailored to meet the needs of Native American and Black communities that are disproportionally represented in child welfare.
- Young people need additional supports and services to successfully transition into adulthood from the child welfare and juvenile rehabilitation systems.

COMPONENTS:

👽 In-Home Services Expansion and Quality Improvement – \$11.8M

- Combined in-home service expansion, including funding specifically dedicated to culturally responsive services
- Capacity-building grants to bring on new providers and provide quality improvement supports to providers

📀 Transition Services – \$5.8M

- Expansion of independent living services for young people transitioning from child welfare and juvenile rehabilitation with the goal of supporting young people to transition into adulthood.
- Lifeset expansion to eight sites across the state and maintain current investment in two existing sites
