
## Behavior Management System

## Rule Violations and Hearing Process

The behavior management system emphasizes restorative and procedural justice principles while maintaining safety and security. This three-tiered approach clearly defines responses to a young person's behavior. Responses will align with an intervention matrix, which staff will be trained to apply consistently when addressing incidents and initiating review processes as needed.

## What are the goals of this process?

- To make decisions and processes that are fair and impartial reducing bias and increasing trust.
- To build transparent and consistent expectations for actions.
- To provide opportunities for staff and youth voice.
- To have logical, related, developmentally appropriate, restorative interventions for violations.



Violations and consequences/interventions listed above are a few examples and not an exhaustive list. Access to religious activities, education, medical care, mental healthcare, hygiene, food, visitation, outdoor time are protected rights and privileges that consequences cannot limit.

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
