

Services may include:

- Daily living skills
- Educational support
- Career exploration
- · Vocational training
- Employment assistance
- Helping to establish stable and healthy connections

Eligibility

Youth are eligible for the IL program if they are/were age 15 to 17 in an established dependency through DCYF, another state's public child welfare agency, or a tribal welfare agency, and in an out-of-home foster care placement for at least 30 days between ages 15 to their 18th birthday. Once initial eligibility is determined, the youth will continue to be eligible.

If a youth enters a permanent plan (returns home, Title 13 guardianship, etc.) after meeting the criteria of eligibility, they continue to be eligible for services from the IL program.

Youth are not eligible if:

- Youth returned home, were adopted, placed in guardianship or dependency guardianship before age 15 (with an out-of-home placement for at least 30 days).
- Youth is under the age of 18 and in a Voluntary Placement Agreement (VPA).
- Youth is under a Child in Need of Services (CHINS) petition.
- Youth is placed in a Juvenile Rehabilitation locked 24-hour facility.
- Youth is not a U.S. citizen.

IL Updates

For the last few years, the program has been going through a legislatively required redesign process and just completed a procurement for service providers. During this time, we also experienced a decrease in our federal funding allocation due to a decline in the number of youths who are DCYF dependents.

How to Refer a Youth for IL Services

- For dependent youth, the caseworker completes an Independent Living Services referral in FamLink (http://intranet.dcyf.wa.gov:8090/drupal-8.4.0/sites/ default/files/training/IndependentLivingReferral-TrainingMaterial.pdf) and submits the completed form to ILSKIDS@dcyf.wa.gov.
- Non-dependent youth or eligible youth from another state can self-refer themselves by contacting their local IL provider or emailing their request to ILSKIDS@dcyf.wa.gov.

Program Changes Starting April 1, 2024

- Possible wait list for youth entering the program.
- Youth Support Funds can be accessed through the local IL Provider for enrolled youth.
- Providers are allowed 60 calendar days to connect and engage with youth, complete their Casey Life Skills Assessment (www.casey.org/casey-life-skills) and Progress Report and Learning Plan (www.dcyf.wa.gov/ forms?field_number_value=15-386&title=)
