

Journey Toward Licensure Checklist

Becoming a licensed foster parent can feel overwhelming. Keep this checklist handy to track your progress or reference as you're moving forward!

Choose Your Path to Licensure:

- Go to the Department of Children, Youth and Families (DCYF) Foster Parenting and Kinship Care website:** www.dcyf.wa.gov/foster.

Complete Required Training:

- Eight-Session Caregiver Core Training (CCT)** *Required for main caregiver, recommended for all caregivers*
 - a. Create a profile on the Alliance website so you can register for classes at:
<https://cpe.socialwork.uw.edu/alliance-courses>
 - b. Register for CCT on the Alliance website:
<https://cpe.socialwork.uw.edu/alliance-courses/content/caregiver-core-training-online>
 - c. After completing all eight sessions, learn more about getting ready to foster from a CaRES mentor with lived experience. Register for and attend, "While You Wait."
- First-Aid and CPR** *Required for all caregivers over the age of 18*
 - a. Search the web for an in-person class near you that fits the age group you want to care for (adult, child, and infant certifications are available).
 1. Red Cross Training: www.redcross.org
 2. If you are unable to locate a class in your area, contact your local fire department.
 - b. Verify with the trainer that the class meets national standards set by the American Heart Association.
 - c. Keep your receipt and certification card.
 - d. Once your license is issued, you can request a refund payment for CPR/First Aid class from your licensor.
- Bloodborne Pathogens Training (BBP)** *Required for all caregivers over the age of 18*

If BBP is offered in the CPR class, a separate course is not required. If you need BBP training, there is a course available through the Alliance at

What you can expect:

- The licensing process takes **approximately 120 days** from the time you complete the online application.
- Be prepared to answer personal questions related to health, mental health, finances, relationships and more.
- A Home Study Specialist will be assigned to you and reach out to schedule interviews including in-person and virtual visits.
- Interviews will be held with all members of the household, including children living outside of the home regardless of their age.
- A home inspection is required to become licensed. Your Home Study Specialist will help you prepare. Review the *Foster Home Licensing Inspection Checklist* (www.dcyf.wa.gov/forms?field_number_value=10-183&title=) to learn what Licensing Division staff are looking for.
- Once your home assessment is complete, you will be provided with a copy of the draft document to review prior to finalization. A copy of the Home Study Assessment and your official Foster Home license certificate will be sent to you.
